## Knitting and Tea and Cookies - Spring 2010 Mystery KAL - 4th Clue

## Note on 4 ${ }^{\text {th }}$ Clue:

This piece is a bracelet, sized S [M, L]
Length: 7.5[8.25, 9] inches

## Materials

Americo Linen Tanguis [50\% tanguis cotton,
50\% linen; 218 yd/199 m per 100g]; color I158; 1 skein (this solid colour is a grey/blue/green tone.) If Substituting Yarn: choose a non-fluffy yarn (the better to show stitches crisply), in a colour flattering to you, in a worsted/ $10 \mathrm{ply} / 9 \mathrm{wpi}$ weight; 130 yards will be enough for all 4 clues. 1 set US \#6/4mm straight needles (or size to obtain gauge)
1 tapestry needle
1 sewing needle
2-3 clear plastic buttons, $5 / 8$ " wide
Optional, for fourth clue only:
3-4 clear plastic buttons, small sizes

## Gauge

20 sts/24 rows $=4$ " in stockinette stitch
Note: with the exception of those used in a decrease, slipped stitches should be slipped purlwise, with the yarn held to the wrong side of the work (which is to say, in front.)

## Abbreviations

## K: knit

K2tog: knit two together
LT: left twist (drop next st on left needle to front of work, K1, pick up dropped st and K)
P: purl
RT: right twist (skip next st on left needle, $k$ 2nd st in front of skipped st, then K skipped st)
sl2tog, K1, psso: slip two together, knit one, pass slipped sts over (slip two sts knitwise as though they were one, K1, pass slipped sts over knit st) ssk: slip slip knit
st: stitch
yo: yarn over

## Directions

Cast on 11 sts

## Section One

Setup Row: sl1, P9, sl1
Row1: [K1, K2tog, yo] three times, K2
Row 2 and all even rows: Sl1, P9, sl1
Row 3: K2, [yo, ssk, K1] three times
Repeat these four rows 0 [1, 2] times more
Section Two
Row 1: K2, LT, [RT] twice, K3
Row 2: Sl1, P3, sl1, P1, sl2, P2, sl1
Row 3: K3, LT, RT, K4
Row 4: Sl1, P4, sl2, P3,sl1
Row 5: K2, RT, LT, K5
Row 6: Sl1, P4, sl1, P2,sl1, P1, sl1
Row 7: K1, RT, K2tog, yo, LT, K4
Row 8: Sl1, P3, [sl1, P2] twice, sl1
Row 9: K6, LT, K3
Row 10: Sl1, P2, sl1, P6, sl1
Row 11: K2, RT, K3, LT, K2
Row 12: Sl1, P1, sl1, P5, sl1, P1, sl1
Row 13: K1, RT, K2, yo, ssk, K4
Row 14: Sl1, P3, sl1, P5, sl1
Row 15: K6, LT, K3
Row 16: Sl1, P2, sl1, P6, sl1
Row 17: K5, RT, LT, K2
Row 18: Sl1, P1, sl1, P2, sl1, P4, sl1

Row 19: K4, RT, K2, LT, K1
Row 20: Sl1, P5, sl1, P3, sl1
Row 21: K3, RT, K6
Row 22: Sl1, P6, sl1, P2, sl1
Row 23: K2, RT, K1, yo, K2tog, K4
Row 24: Sl1, [P3, sl1] twice, P1, sl1
Row 25: K1, RT, K8
Row 26: Sl1, P to last st, sl1
Row 27: K3, LT, K6
Row 28: Sl1, P5, sl1, P3, sl1
Row 29: K4, LT, K2, RT, K1
Row 30: Sl1, K1,sl1, K2, sl1, K4, sl1
Row 31: K5, LT, RT, K2
Row 32: Sl1, P2, sl2, P5, sl1
Row 33: K2, ssk, yo, K2, LT, K3
Row 34: Sl1, P2, sl1, P4, sl1, P1, sl1
Row 35: K5, RT, LT, K2
Row 36: Sl1, P1, Sl1, P2, sl1, P4, sl1
Row 37: K4, RT, K2, LT, K1
Row 38: Sl1, P5, sl1, P3, sl1
Row 39: K3, RT, K6
Row 40: Sl1, P6, sl1, P2, sl1
Row 41: K2, RT, K7
Cast off knitwise.


## Note on the chart:

The first 12 rows are for the button band, and reflect the largest size. If knitting the smallest, work only the first four rows before moving to the next section; for the middle size, work only the first eight.

## Finishing

Run in ends and wet block. When dry, wrap around wrist to determine where to sew the two larger closure buttons, lining them up with whichever eyelets from the button cuff suit you. Sew remaining buttons randomly over tennis bracelet to resemble dewdrops (or diamonds!)
