# Shelter Valley Cowl

This quick unisex cowl is great for gift-giving. Knit on the reverse, it's easy to make and cosy to wear whichever side you choose to show – inside, outside, or even upside down!

#### **Materials**

Biscotte et Cie La Grande Douce (80% superwash merino wool, 10% cashmere, 10% nylon, 202 yards, 115g), 1 skein (www.biscottcie.com) 4.0mm 16" circular or double point needles, or size to obtain gauge stitch marker darning needle

#### Gauge

18 sts, 27 rows = 4" in stocking st, after blocking

**Finished Dimensions** 

19.5" circumference, 6" long

#### **Abbreviations**

K: knit.
P: purl.
ssk: slip the next two sts as if to knit, then knit them together.
st(s): stitch(es).
yo: yarn over.



## **Directions**

Using 4.0 mm circular needles, cast on 108 sts, place marker, and join to work in the round.

Bottom Border

Rounds 1, 2: \*K1, P1; repeat from \* to end of round.

Rounds 3, 4: \*P1, K1; repeat from \* to end of round.

Body

Round 1: \*K4, yo, ssk; repeat from \* to end of round. Rounds 2-6: \*K4, P1, K1; repeat from \* to end of round. Round 7: \*K1, yo, ssk, K3; repeat from \* to end of round. Rounds 8-12: \*K1, P1, K4; repeat from \* to end of round. Repeat Rounds 1-12 twice more.

## Top Border

Rounds 1, 2: \*P1, K1; repeat from \* to end of round.

Round 3: \*K1, P1; repeat from \* to end of round.

Round 4: Cast off, following the K1, P1 stitch pattern established in Round 3.

## Finishing

Cut an 8-10" tail, run in ends and block. Turn it inside out or leave it as is, and enjoy!
