## Confectionery Cap

Wear your cake and eat it too! A special ribbing, a luxurious lattice, and two scrumptious colours turn this hat into an oversized petit-four. To minimize any pattern jogging on either side of the start-of-row marker, a little duplicate stitch finishes off the trimming at the back. Samples shown were knit in Child (crown version II) and Adult Medium sizes.

## Materials

Debbie Bliss Baby Cashmerino (55\% Merino wool, 33\% Microfibre, 12\% Cashmere, $125 \mathrm{~m} / 50 \mathrm{~g}$ ) 1 ball color 340010 - purple (A), 1 ball color 340018 - green (B)
1 set $3.25 \mathrm{~mm} / \mathrm{US} 3$ double-pointed needles (dpns) or size to obtain gauge
1 set $3.5 \mathrm{~mm} / \mathrm{US} 4$ double pointed needles (for use in the ribbing only) or 1-2 sizes larger than that used to obtain gauge
1 stitch marker
darning needle

## Gauge

Royal Quilting stitch on 3mm/US 3 needles:
27 sts, 40 rows $=4$ "

## Finished Dimensions

Child (Youth; Adult Medium; Adult Large)
16.75 " around, 6 " long (17.75" around, 6.5" long; $18.5 "$ around, 7 " long; 19.5" around, 7.5 " long)


## Directions

Using 3.25 mm needles and $A$, cast on $114(120,126,132)$ sts and divide onto dpns, leaving a multiple of three on each. Place marker at beginning of round and join.
Round 1: With 3.5 mm needle on the right, *K2, P1; repeat from * to end of round.
Round 2: With 3.25 mm needle on the right, *K $2^{\text {nd }}$ st through, K $1^{\text {st }}$ st, P 1 ; repeat from ${ }^{*}$ to end of round. (Note: be sure to work both sts here as it is very easy to forget to knit the $1^{\text {st }}$ st and very difficult to pick it up again on subsequent rows.)
Repeat these two rows $2(3,4,5)$ times more or until the ribbing measures $.75(1,1.25,1.5)$ ". Set 3.5 mm dpns aside and continue with 3.25 mm dpns only.
Body (Royal Quilting)
Round 1: With A, [K1, sl2 wyib] twice, *K1, sl5 wyif; repeat from * to last 6 sts, [ K1, sl2 wyib] twice.
Rounds 2-4: With B, knit to end of round.
Round 5: With A, [K1, sl2 wyib] twice, *K1, sl2 wyib, PUL, K1, sl2 wyib; repeat from * to last 6 sts, [K1, sl2 wyib] twice.
Round 6: With A, K1, sl2 wyib, *K1, sl5 wyif; repeat from * to last 3 sts, K1, sl2 wyib.
Rounds 7-9: With B, knit to end of round.
Round 10: With A, K1, sl2 wyib, * K1, sl2 wyib, PUL, K1, sl2 wyib; repeat from * to last 3 sts K1, sl2 wyib. Repeat these 10 rounds twice more, then work Rounds 1-5 once more.

## Crown

Version I: Crown is worked entirely in A until and including Round 18 (20, 20, 22).
Version II: Even rows are worked in B until and including Round 18 (20, 20, 22).
Round 1: *K17 (38, 12, 20), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round - $108(117,117,126)$ sts.
Round 2 and all even rows to Round 18 (20, 20, 22): K.
Round 3: * K10 (11, 11, 12), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round - $99(108,108,117)$ sts.
Round 5: * K9 (10, 10, 11), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round - $90(99,99,108)$ sts.
Round 7: * K8 (9, 9, 10), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round - $81(90,90,99)$ sts.
Round 9: * K7 (8, 8, 9), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round - $72(81,81,90)$ sts.

## Abbreviations

## A: Color A.

B: Color B.
K: knit.
$\mathbf{K} \mathbf{2}^{\text {nd }}$ st through K $\mathbf{1}^{\text {st }}$ st: slip the tip of the right needle through the first st on the left as if to purl, then K the second st on the left and, leaving it on the needle, K the first st through its back loop. K2tog: Knit two together.

## P: purl.

PUL or 'pick up loop': using the tip of the right needle, pick up the loop left in front during a previous row; slip it behind the next st on the left needle so that it lies between the first and second sts; when the sts are worked, the loop is caught behind the centre st.
sl: slip st as if to purl.
slwyib: slip the specified number of sts as if to purl with the yarn held loosely behind the work. slwyif: slip the specified number of sts as if to purl with the yarn held loosely in front of the work.
st(s): stitch(es).


Round 11: * K6 (7, 7, 8), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round - $63(72,72,81)$ sts.
Round 13: * K5 (6, 6, 7), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round $-54(63,63,72)$ sts.
Round 15: * K4 (5, 5, 6), K2tog; repeat from * to end of round - $45(54,54,63)$ sts.
Round 17: * K3 $(4,4,5)$, K2tog; repeat from * to end of round $-36(45,45,54)$ sts.
Round 19: *K1 $(0,0,0)$ B, K1 $(3,3,4)$ A, K2tog A; repeat from * to end of round $-27(36,36,45)$ sts.
Round 20: *K1 $(0,0,0) B, \mathrm{~K} 2(4,4,5) \mathrm{A}$; repeat from * to end of round.
Round 21: *K1 $(1,1,0)$ B, $\mathrm{K} 0(1,1,3)$ A, K2tog A; repeat from * to end of round - $18(27,27,36)$ sts. Size XS ends here.
Round 22: *K $-(1,1,0) \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{K}-(2,2,4) \mathrm{A}$; repeat from * to end of round.
Round 23: *K $-(1,1,1) \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{K}-(0,0,1) \mathrm{A}, \mathrm{K} 2 \operatorname{tog} \mathrm{~A}$; repeat from * to end of round - - $(18,18,27)$ sts. Sizes S and M end here.
Round 24: *K $-(-,-, 1) \mathrm{B}, \mathrm{K}-(-,-, 2) \mathrm{A}$; repeat from * to end of round.
Round 25: *K $-(-,-, 1)$ B, K2tog A; repeat from * to end of round $--(-,-, 18)$ sts. Size $L$ ends here.

## Finishing

Cut an 8-10" tail for both A and B and, with a darning needle, thread A through the remaining 18 sts, turning the hat inside out to pull them tight. Run in both tails inside the hat.
Using a strand of A and a darning needle, use duplicate stitch to complete any stitches or lattice pattern at the beginning and end of each round. Run in remaining ends and block hat.
